Receiving communion Please may we remind you that it is not acceptable to dip your wafer into the wine when receiving communion, as it risks spreading germs. If, for any reason, you do not wish to share the chalice with others, it is perfectly acceptable just to receive the wafer / bread. The church's teaching is that to receive the consecrated bread alone is to receive the sacrament fully, and this has always been the theological understanding of the Church of England.

Eco Actions for March – Going shopping



Could you manage to do some of these this month – where relevant? They could soon become habits – good ones! Some might save you money, but even more important, they will all really help in caring for the world and its people.

1. Make a list before you go food shopping to help avoid over impulse buying and buying food you will end up throwing away.

- 2. Reduce your impact on the environment by buying second hand when you can. Ebay and charity shops are good sources of reused items.
- 3. When you need to buy a large item, research it carefully. Think about how long it could last, how much it costs to run, what it is made of, where it is made, and whether it be recycled at the end of its life. Better quality items often last longer and therefore cost less over time.
- 4. Are you tempted to buy on impulse when you are shopping? Get into the habit of going back the next day or week, when you have thought through if you really *need* to buy something!

Eastleigh Basics Bank are always very grateful for our support, and at the moment, due to the rise in the cost of living, the need is greater than ever. Giving using the card machine and via the Donate button on our website For some people, using the card machine is ideal, and it is especially helpful for the public at special events. Giving via the website is a very straightforward way of donating, especially for those who do not normally attend church. Please be aware, however, that there is a small charge (just under 2%) to the church for donations made in this way. We encourage church members to give to our church regularly if they can, and the Parish Giving Scheme, a standing order, or cash / cheque in a stewardship envelope are the best ways to do this. The Parish Giving Scheme tops them all, as they administer the Gift Aid for us!
